




Fig. 1 - Reverse Dark Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 2 - Relative Reverse Light Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 3 - Reverse Light Current vs. Irradiance




Fig. 4 - Reverse Light Current vs. Reverse Voltage






Fig. 5 - Diode Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage




Fig. 6 - Relative Spectral Sensitivity vs. Wavelength





Fig. 7 - Relative Radiant Sensitivity vs. Angular Displacement




Fig. 8 - Drawing Proportions not scaled



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
